**CLUB PRESIDENTS REPORT – SEASON 2012**

Of the many significant achievements during the 2012 Season, the return of the Seniors to the NSW Suburban 1<sup>st</sup> Division was the most eagerly anticipated. Driving off the hard work of the Seniors both on and off the field on 2011 where they claimed the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Premiership in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Division Competition, the Club earned the right to be promoted back into 1<sup>st</sup> Division – and no one expected it to be an easy ride !

Whilst the Seniors' 2012 results were probably not quite as they would have wished, the re-emergence of the Club into the 1<sup>st</sup> Division competition across the Grades was noted by all of their opposition. This will no doubt be covered further in the Seniors Report – however, congratulations must be extended to the Club's Bourke Cup (2<sup>nd's</sup>) team for reaching the finals series, only to fall at the second last hurdle.

The Board extends it's congratulations to Joe McSwiney & Patrick Galvin, who gained selection in the Combined NSW Suburban Rugby Representative Team in 2012. This team played matches against Qld Subbies and NSW Country, and it is fantastic to see Hillies players amongst these representative players again.

The Board extends it's sincere thanks to Seniors Chairman Rod Salmon and all those on the Seniors Committee and all of the people who have supported Rod and the Committee this year, to ensure it's success. Without the continued dedication of all of the "unsung heroes" - the canteen organizers, the volunteers who help set up the ground and facilities at each home game, and who are there at the end of each Saturday helping clean up and pack everything away the Club could not function – and we thank you sincerely.

The Juniors' enjoyed another tremendously successful 2012 Season – and with more than 500 participants, makes Hunters Hill one of the largest Junior Club's in the Sydney region. Again, many of the highlights will no doubt be covered in the Juniors Report – however, special mention must go to the 6 teams who finished the season as minor premiers (4 of which went through the season undefeated) in the SJRU competition. Of the 10 teams who managed to contest finals series matches, 3 went on to take the ultimate prize - being crowned Premiers for Season 2012 - a remarkable achievement in anyone's books.

Special mention should also be made of the 54 boys who gained representative selection through the Club's affiliation with Norths Juniors, and who participated in the NSWJRU State Championships on the June long weekend.

It is important to remember that not everything about club rugby is to do with winning or participating in a competition. The Juniors have a large contingent of "minis" – those kids between 4 and 9 who turn up every Saturday just for a run and a bit of fun!



Congratulations to all of the parents and volunteers who give up their time to train, referee and support these young rugby players of tomorrow. It is hoped that through their experience as Juniors, that these boys will flow through to provide the Seniors with the players of tomorrow.

This spirit is exemplified in the "Dufficy Cup" – which has developed into an extremely successful event – where young U9 players form Clubs across Sydney come to Boronia Park on the last Friday night of their season – to participate in their first match under lights in "Friday Night Rugby" – many of them playing on a full sized field for the first time. This is an initiative of the Club and is in anticipation of their transition into the SJRU Competition for U10's and up, in the following year. This is a perfect example of how Hunters Hill Rugby is leading the way in offering positive rugby experiences to the potential senior players of tomorrow.

To Junior's Chairman Ben Gregory and the significant number of volunteer committee members, coaches, managers, canteen workers and referees who make this happen on a weekly basis - the Board extends it's sincere thanks for another wonderful season.

The Cats.....what can one say ? Several more editions of "The Purring Pussy", a number of extremely successful road trips, and plenty of stories. Can life get any better than that ?

The Club's thanks are again extended to the Cat-ocracy, for their continued support of the Club, their unerring diligence in correcting the referees from Cat Corner when a refereeing mistake is made, and their wonderful support and advice being offered for free - and at length – to anyone who will listen, when they perceive any shortcomings from the players on the field.

To Chairman "Meow" – Gary Lane – and the rest of the Cats - gentlemen, thank you again for your support, as without you we wouldn't be the great Club that we are today.

On a more subdued note, I am saddened to report the passing of one of our Life members – Eric Robson – during the year. Eric maintained a significant interest in the Club, always enquiring how the weekend's matches went, when he managed to run into a club member around the suburbs. and he will be sorely missed. The Club again extends its deepest sympathies to Eric's family and friends – he will be sorely missed by all who new him.

To our Co-Patrons, Mr Gordon Bray and Mayor Sue Hoopmann, thank you for again agreeing to support our Club in accepting these positions, and for your efforts during the year on behalf of the Club. We are certainly fortunate to have such unabashed supporters of Hunters Hill Rugby.

We also need to thank the staff at Hunters Hill Council, (with special thanks to Phil Sutton & Tim Mills) for their continued assistance during the season, and for again providing us with the excellent ovals that we perhaps take for granted at times.

The Club continues to grow and prosper, and make significant in-roads into improving facilities for players and spectators alike. 2012 saw continued work on the B3 Re-Development, with the oval slowly taking shape. Disrupted significantly by adverse weather conditions and a lack of suitable material at critical times, this project hasn't proceeded as quickly as everyone would have hoped. It is nonetheless progressing towards a conclusion, and it is hoped that this oval will be ready for use during the 2013 season. Plans also for the Community Facility continue to be fine tuned and it is hoped that this project too will move forward significantly in 2013, with plans to be presented to Council for formal DA approval, hopefully in the near future.

The Club continues to seek ways of recognizing significant areas of achievement within it's ranks – and 2012 saw the introduction of 3 new Club awards, all having specific eligibility criteria:



- The Ian Kellaway Shield - for the best performing Juniors team in the regular competition season, and which was this year won by the Under 14A team, who finished the season undefeated, as Minor Premiers and SJRU Grand Final Champions;
- The Andrew Mostyn Shield – awarded to the best performing Overall Club team (Juniors and Seniors) in the regular competition season, and which was this year won by the Juniors Under 10C White team.
- The Allan Southcombe Award - instituted to recognize outstanding service to the Club by a current or former player, which was this year awarded to James Walker for his involvement in coaching Junior teams at Hunters Hill and also his service to NSW Rugby as a senior NSW Rugby Referee;

The Board congratulates the above inaugural recipients of these awards, as well as all of the other Club award winners in 2012 – and all of which are recognized within this Annual Report.

In conclusion, 2012 has been another very successful year for the Club, both on and off the field, and the Board would like to express their sincere thanks to all of the people who have supported the Club during the year in the best way possible – by turning up and either playing, helping or just watching the “Hillies” run around each weekend, and we hope that you will return for what is shaping up to be a great 2013 Season.

## Hunters Hill "Mostyn & Kellaway Shields" - Eligibility

The "Andrew Mostyn" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season of the junior AND senior clubs combined.

The "Ian Kellaway" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season in the junior club.

Teams eligible to participate in the Shields are teams registered with the Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club or Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Union Football Club involved in any full season, outdoor winter rugby competition administered by NSW Subbies or SJRU. (ie for juniors only includes from U10 and above)

Teams are eligible to only win one shield each season – ie the team that wins the "Andrew Mostyn" shield becomes ineligible for the "Ian Kellaway" and it shall be awarded to the next qualified team.

### Hunters Hill "Memorial Shields" - Criteria

1. The Shield is awarded to the team which finishes the highest in its division during the regular season ie. before commencement of play-off rounds.
  
2. In the event that two or more teams finish in the same highest position eg. first, the winner is the team that earns the maximum percentage of competition (win/draw) points which are available to them during the regular season. Note: this excludes any bonus point system.  
The maximum points available may vary depending on the number of teams in the competition draw therefore a review of the competition size is required to ensure that maximum points available from actual matches played ie. excluding byes, are the only ones included. (eg a team playing in a 6 team competition may play more games than a team in an 8 team competition providing the team with a greater opportunity to gain more total points). The calculation will be the number of wins (of games actually played) divided by the number of games played. Draws shall count as ½ of a win. This should be calculated as a percentage of the total points available calculated to 2 decimal places.
  
3. In the case where two or more teams obtain the same percentage of maximum points available the winner will be determined by:
  - a) The team with the highest points ratio (points for divided by points against); and if still equal
  - b) The team with the highest points differential from games played (points for minus points against) and if still equal
  - c) If still equal then - Declare the relevant team's joint winners of Shield.

## Vice Chairman's Report - Seniors 2012

A successful season, far from if only not for an unsuccessful one. The year was a mixed bag of trepidation into the unknown for most in Division 1, but a step back in history and the glory days of Hunters Hill rugby for my vintage and older. With the main goal of winning the Kentwell Cup and being Club Champions, it was going to be a mean feat, albeit with the huge recruitment drive in the off season led by Paul Shields, after the almost abolishment of the 2011 winning Barraclough Cup team. This led to a number a new faces coming to Boronia Park and the excitement of competing for Subbies highest prize, won 8 times before by Hunters Hill, the 2<sup>nd</sup> most by any Subbies club.

Round 1 around the 80th minute of the Kentwell Cup fixture proved to be a pivotal moment when after leading all game, the ball was knocked from the back of the ruck and a Campbelltown player dived on it to score a try, needing to convert to win by a point, they duly did and disappointed what could have proved to be a very successful opening day, having won all but 2nds.

This led to us competing well, but not quite up to matching Drummoyne and St Pats (who both contested the GF), then another disappointing draw v Mosman (the one that got away). Then losses to Knox, Colleagues, Barker (badly) and narrowly again to Campbelltown, saw us on the bottom of the ladder and wondering where it had gone wrong and how to fix it.

Through it all we had two Subbies representatives, with deserved congratulations to Joe McSwiney and Patrick Galvin, both did the club proud and played great games in v NSW Country and Qld Subbies at the SFS, my highlight was Joe making a huge hit on a NSW Country player who lost the ball and NSW Subbies picking it up and running 60m to score what proved to be the match winning try. Sadly both Irish boys were injured for much of the season after this, but played their part to bolster the Hunters Hill ranks and we wish them well back in Ireland and spread the HH word, hopefully we'll see them back next season.

Management decided to postpone the 1<sup>st</sup> grade fixture v Old Iganations while our rep players were unavailable. This led to a rescheduled match on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> July at Boronia at night. This decision proved beneficial and another pivotal change in the season which brought about our first Kentwell Cup win just a month shy of ten years since the last. The score 16-13 didn't show the dominance, and although Iggies had a missed penalty attempt to draw on full time, we had turned the corner, with a plethora of missed chances and ignorance to take a shot at penalty goal (a major bug bear of mine). We dominated a team we convincingly beat in a trial and had confidence that by winning creates a winning culture. Vili, Connal, Jake, Pat and Joe all had big games and the return from injury by Dave Weston brought the team together to finish off the year in style.

Heavy losses to Grand finalists, Drummoyne and St Pats followed then 4 wins out of last 7 and only narrow losses to semi finalists Colleagues and Beecroft saw us finish 8<sup>th</sup> and secured life in Div 1 in 2013.

For 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade it was a grandstand finish but a year what could have been. Andy again proving he can bring a team together as they beat every team in the comp, even with some paint left on the walls in the change rooms but those finals matches are hard to win and I thought although St Pats were the benchmark, I also thought we could have gone all the way. To win a comp it takes preparation and team training and commitment of players for the whole season, hopefully with the quality of new players 2nds landed, they can stick around and train hard and bring it all together next season.

For 3<sup>rd</sup>s, 4ths, 5ths, all dealing with injuries, changes and no settled combinations, it was certainly a struggle to get teams selected and something which needs to happen better for teams to be settled and playing together. 82, 83 and 85 players played in 3<sup>rd</sup>s, 4<sup>th</sup>s and 5<sup>th</sup> respectively to all finish 6<sup>th</sup> is credible and something for the coaches and club to work on for next year. Thanks to the new coaches, in Will, Tony in 4ths and Tony Whaling in 5ths for doing the best with what they had and hopefully will be back to build on lessons learnt.

Colts had the nucleus of a good side, but with a few key injuries and game times changing, it was a tough season, but good to see some juniors come through and also some talent identified. With Pat and Arthur Simpson, Andrew Burton, Rhys McDermott, Damien Robinson and Brad Chalmers all names we'll see in higher grades in the future. The highlight for me was them doing the double over



Colleagues. The Cats are all happy about that. Well done Steve Turner on trying to keep this group together and preparing them for higher grades in years to come.

Finally to the committee, there have been smoother years and there have been better years but thank you all for your time and effort in keeping the behind the scenes ball rolling. A job well done to stay up and to do as well as we did off the field as on it. Big well done to Tim Vertoudakis, taking on the registrar role and getting on top of it all, I have tried to groom you for future years and hopefully you'll be well versed to carry it on in the future. Thank you to Jordan Butler for putting his hand up when no one else did, the Treasurer role is difficult when chasing people for money is involved and it shouldn't get to be like that. Players should be up front and pay up like joining any club, I'd like to think that the Players Manual recreated this year will play a more significant role in years to come, to be able to show members the rules and have then applied to the benefit of all. Jules, another time poor secretary doing a fantastic job, hope you enjoyed it and seen the insides to running the club which I think you'll make a great Chairman one day. Thanks to Shieldsy great job on pushing all the right people and recruiting so many good new players, Steve with the monitoring of jerseys and the great looking training ones, Tim Forsyth great job on the raffles and hopefully you and your mates will be running the club in the future. Mark 'Rosie' Thornton a massive thank you for a thankless task of setting up and packing away at the ground and with your wife Natasha in the canteen, you've done a wonderful job for the club and hopefully more people like you can be found to step up and help and Garrett 'Irish' Bourke for being there and helping out where you could.

Many thanks to Rod, again the driving force behind keeping everything going, it's been a pleasure to be deputy over the past 3 years and hopefully more people like you can be found to drive the club forward.

I've enjoyed my time on the committee, I'm glad to have seen the club back to Div 1 and it's time to step down and I look forward to the younger, enthusiastic, committed players to step up and put into the club to get maximum enjoyment out of it.

## Club Captain's Report – Seniors 2012

2012 was an interesting year for Hunters Hill Rugby to say the least, but with time comes perspective, and now some time on I feel I can finally make sense of this season past. At Hillies we tend to set our own goals, measure from within ourselves and aim high, but facts are facts and the hard one is, we failed to reach our own lofty goals and disappointed ourselves. Despite this we performed better than any other club who entered division 1 in the last 5 years. It was not a year full of accolades and celebrations, but any achievements were hard earned and heartfelt.

Often clubs focus on 1<sup>st</sup> grade as the yardstick of success, by which, Hillies had an unbearably unlucky season. However, a true measure of depth and talent throughout a club is often seen in the performance of 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. For years now 2<sup>nd</sup> grade have proven the strength of our club. In a year where 1<sup>st</sup> grade made a much too late climb up the ladder, 2<sup>nd</sup> grade were switched on from start to semi-final finish. This depth of quality was also reflected in the turnaround performance of 1<sup>st</sup> grade in the latter half of the season despite heavy injury toll. A second round, near worthy of a semi-finals berth shocked other clubs, but only justified the belief that had always been within the team. There is no sugar coating though. We did not perform as well as we had hoped, nor as well as we could have. Key issues ran throughout near every side in the club. Injuries top to bottom could be traced to a less than ideal fitness regime in preseason and a lack of in-season training, as with weather concerns we devolved into a one training per week club. Pivotal roles such as fly halves and kickers were improvised in many grades, a deficit emphasised by so many close defeats.

3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade performed stoically amongst tough conditions, selfless or involuntary loss of players to higher grades and early morning starts. All with their own collection of 'W's to their names, the lower grades proved they could perform if the conditions were right. 2013 can be a more successful year if we focus on getting these conditions right and it begins before even the preseason, getting numbers to flesh out a 6 grade club.

Many things galvanise my hope for next season, amongst them the admirable performance of a new, young colts side. ## Colts Barbour Cup Report 2012

On the face of it you could conclude that Colts had a poor season with only seven wins and eleven losses and while results are our primary barometer, we did achieve some important objectives for 2012

One of our goals this year was to build a positive and inclusive culture, in order to create a strong bond on and off the field, with the rest of the Club. If we are to look at maintaining a high profile in Suburban Rugby, it is important for us to provide a pathway for players transitioning from school/juniors to senior Rugby. We need to provide an atmosphere that is welcoming, accommodating and enjoyable.

Right from the first pre-seasonal sessions we trained on the same nights as the graded teams, assisted on game days, ran water, engaged in linesmen's duties, field set up, helped with raffles etc. Along the way the boys formed new friendships and cultivated a pretty decent bond with their Club. If a Colt did not make the starting line up they were selected to play in grade. Along the way Pat Simpson became a regular first grader, Arthur Simpson a valued second grader and Christian Zizza one of third grades best. Several of the boys also became integral to fourth's campaign. At some point most of the Colts spent some time with the graded teams, including some sneaky appearances the Coaches didn't know about 😊

The group looked very different to the successful Colts teams of the previous two years. Most of the boys were first year out of school, leaving Damian Robinson, Brad Chalmers, Rhys Mc Dermott, Tim Forsyth and Will Sutcliffe to provide the core of experienced players, so necessary for progress and success. These players had figured prominently in thirds great run last year, so much was expected of them.

We looked good in the trials, the highlight being a win under lights, against eventual Minor Premiers and Grand Finalists, Old Ignatians. Our first round of matches however could be described as inconsistent. After winning the first game against a physical Campbelltown team, we were brought back to earth by a very impressive Drummoyne outfit. We suffered a close loss to eventual Premiers Knox and very nearly upset Iggies at home, but our good performances were punctuated with some unacceptable ones, in particular the home loss to Barker. Our away game against Campbelltown proved to be a watershed, with a memorable defensive effort against a huge Quins outfit. With barely a starting team and several players out of position, the boys showed courage beyond what would have normally been expected. There followed a heartbreaking one point loss to Drummoyne and a 0-5 defeat by Pats, the latter game one where we dominated field position for 60 minutes. By this stage injuries were really starting to affect the squad, however we finished the season with a memorable win after the bell against Colleagues and two solid wins against Beecroft.

The 2012 Colts were a young side, for the most part first year out of school. Considering the age and physical maturity of the better sides in the Barbour Cup, the boys can take much from the season. It is very exciting to know that most of the players will still be eligible for Colts in 2013, where we feel certain Hunters Hill will make an impression.

Working with Loni Katoa has been a pleasure. The depth of his Rugby knowledge and his commitment right throughout the season has been really appreciated. The big man doesn't talk that much, but when he does, we all pay attention!

## 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Judd Cup Report 2012

All in all it was an enjoyable season for the two unemployed Kiwi coaches. We would like to thank all the boys that played for us this season. We were proud to be able to coach this team and we look forward to next year.

### Chairman's Report - Juniors 2012

It has been another fine season for the juniors at Hunters Hill. Once again not only did we perform very well out on the paddock but the progress we have made off the field has been just as rewarding. Success such as we have seen doesn't come easily and I must firstly thank our dedicated juniors committee whom have worked tirelessly this season to make sure our club remains at the forefront of junior rugby and the local community groups.

This season saw our wonderful sponsors (McGrath, Grays Online, FDC, Jaycar & Advanced Audio Visuals) were all back again supporting the club and we thank them very much for their continued efforts in helping us get the local kids out on the paddock each week. I do hope we can all reciprocate and in turn support these fantastic patrons of our club. A new partnership was formed early this season with Simon Hockings and East West Physio. The expertise and professionalism that Simon has brought the ovals each Friday and Sunday has been fantastic - so much so that I have noticed whole families lining up for treatment as soon as the "Physio On Duty" signs go up. So many thanks to Simon and I can thoroughly recommend his services to all and sundry.

On the field we had another very successful season. We had registrations of over 500 players once again and this saw us field 15 minis teams and 19 competition teams. The minis once again played in both the Gordon / Norths minis comps as well as the Inner West minis competition on a rotation basis. This meant that our boys got to play against a very broad range of teams across Sydney and hopefully



enhanced their rugby experience as they learn the game. The Under 9's again finished off their time in the minis by hosting the "Dufficy Cup" at Boronia on a Friday night, where the U9 teams from the Norths District came together to play on a full field using U10 rules to get some experience (for boys and parents) of what is to follow next season. This evening was a huge success.

Just as a bit of background, TAC was established in 2008 and is comprised of 7 members - Brian Robertson, Bruce Lycett, Ron White, John Hibbert, Colin Laundry, Allan Southcombe and myself. At least 2 of the members meet every Monday morning to identify and catalogue all historical material held by our Club.

Initially the Committee worked out of Ron White's garage but when he decided to move house, earlier this year, we found a new 'home' in a room under Henley Bowling Club. This was achieved with the help of Hunters Hill Council, who have leased this room to us at a peppercorn rent, and the Junior and Senior Clubs who share the cost of this lease.

Our work during 2012 has involved:

- Cataloguing Club photos - to date have recorded nearly 600.
- Cataloguing, packaging and storing trophies, pennants, plaques and shields to prevent deterioration.
- Filing mountains of paper into yearly folders.
- Video recording interviews of past players, supporters and presidents - 25 to date.
- Transferring 25 Grand Final games, involving Hunters Hill, from video cassette tape to DVD.
- Compiling statistical games and player databases.
- Holding an exhibition at Boronia Park, focusing on the 1972, 1982 and 1992 premierships winning teams.

We have advertised in the daily papers and the weekly locals, as well as having an article published in the TWT. Our advertisements have asked for people to lend or donate to TAC memorabilia relating to Hunters Hill Rugby. We have had limited response to these advertisements, however, recently I received a call from a 95 year old gentleman from Cessnock who had a photo of a Hunters Hill rugby team taken in 1907 with his father and uncle in it. He did not trust Australia Post to deliver the photo so got his daughter to catch a train down to Sydney to hand deliver it to me.

We still have plenty of work to do.

Our ultimate aim is to one day display many of these items in a 'Community Facility', and to make the photos available to all through the Clubs website.

The TAC Committee would like to thank the generous support of players and supporters who helped us raise enough money to buy a new laptop, and allow us to buy storage containers and archiving material.
