CLUB PRESIDENTS REPORT – SEASON 2017

125 years of Hunters Hill Rugby, and the 125th year was remarkable for a whole set of reasons. The club was awarded the highest honour in NSW – Rugby Club of the Year. This is a fantastic recognition of the great work done on and off at HHRUFC. We have a wonderful set of players, supporters and volunteers – and to receive this award in its inaugural year speaks volumes about our club. Results on the field continued to reflect the strong club culture, and we undertook some innovative approaches to both rugby and non-rugby community engagement.

HH Seniors had a tremendous year – winning a number of key accolades:

- 2nd Division Subbies Club of the Year
- 2nd Division Club Champions
- 3rd Grade Premiers
- 1st Grade Runners-up (in a close and very exciting final)
- Alex Nomination for Colt of the Year
- 2nd in Cowboy Cup
- 4 teams contesting Semi-Finals

The club also hosted wonderful events at their home games, including a bumper **Ladies Day**, and what is reputed to be the biggest '**Back to Boronia Day**' on record (special mention to Michael McNamara for his efforts in organizing a terrific reunion).

The inauguration of the **HHRUFC Women's Rugby** side – the Boronia's – was marked in 2017. This is a massive step forward for the club, and it was a thrill to see them win their debut game on B2 this year. Hearing the Club song sung by these women rugby players was something that those present will never forget! The Board are working hard with the Senior Club to ensure that the Women's Rugby side are given all of the support that they need to be successful.

I would like to recognize a few key clubman for their contributions in 2017:

- Head Coach **Clint Allardice** – in his first year with the club, achieved the goals set out of winning the 2nd Div Club Championship – although I know he was understandably disappointed to be shaded in the 1st Grade Grand Final. He was well supported by the other coaches, and we appreciate his efforts;
- I would like to call out **Cooper Henwood** – who was named the Senior Club's Best & Fairest Player – which is extra special given that Cooper is a HH Junior;
- As with last year - **Pam and Al Evans** – for their tireless work in the Canteen and around Boronia;
- **Andrew Johnson** (300 Games) and **Tim Dodds** (400 Games) – remarkable achievements!



- **Paul Shields** – who never stops. He has the worst Bluetooth in Australia – partly due to the fact that he is on the phone all day pestering people about Rugby. He drove a terrific outcome for our 2017/2018 sponsors, and continues to keep the wheels turning in the Seniors.
- And finally Chairman **Gary Lane** – there is not much more I can say about this bloke. His love of the club is plain to see – and it gave me tremendous pleasure to have him (and Adam Latham) on stage with me to receive the NSW Club of the year Award. He was quite emotional. To quote Shakespeare *'Uneasy lies the head that wears a crown'*.

Kentwell Cup now awaits in 2018, and the Club will get an opportunity to renew its historic rivalries against clubs like Colleagues and Petersham. Depth is a rare commodity in modern day rugby.....and we all need to work hard to ensure HHRUFC is competitive in 1st Division.

The Junior Club bucked the trend of many Junior clubs across Sydney, and maintained registration numbers for 2017. The club has created a tremendous base to grow – and under new Chairman **Adam Latham**, created some exciting new initiatives to drive interest in rugby in the local community.

There were 5 teams in finals this year, with only one team making it to a Grand Final (U12's) but unfortunately going down. While for some the number of premierships is a sign of success, but so to is kids having fun, being properly graded, so they can enjoy their rugby in a competitive environment. This is a constant balancing act, and something the Junior Club works very hard at.

2017 saw the club field its first Girls team – the HH Pinks. These guys were amazing in every game that they played, and also had the great experience of providing the Honour Guard at the Bledisloe Cup game in Sydney.

A large number of HH Juniors represented Northern Suburbs District, and also Metropolitan North in the higher Rep levels. We also had a number of players turn out for the Sydney Junior Rep side in the annual City vs Country fixture.

I would like to call out Angus Bell, former HH Junior Player, who was picked in the 2017 Australian Schoolboy team. It was great to see so many HH folks at TG Milner to support him in the game against NZ.

The Junior Club Hosted the Sydney Regionals – which is considered to be the best Junior Rugby Tournament in the state – comprising both Sydney and Counties best players in a two day format. Combined with the benchmark Dufficy Cup), HH Juniors does its fair share to ensure Boronia Park is a centre of gravity for NSW Rugby.

2018 will present new challenges to the Junior Club, as competition for family attention increases. The club is in excellent hands with their Chairman Adam Latham, and has a great new committee for 2018.

The 'heart and soul' of HHRUFC is **the Cats** – had a tremendous year. They continued to coordinate the BBQ for the Seniors Home Games, and also were well represented at all Social Events across the rugby calendar. I want to acknowledge Peter McFarlane for his tireless efforts in keeping this disparate group of rugby gypsies informed and organized. The legacy that the Cats provide is the envy of many clubs..... The Archive Committee (TAC) continues to carefully document the rich history of our proud club, and without their efforts, many of the great achievements would be lost. It is critical that this work continues, and that they are provided the support they need to do their job.

And finally the Board...

Since I joined the Board our focus has been on the following key areas:

- Financial stability of the sub-committees;
- Engagement with Council;
- Continued good Governance and Brand Management.



FINANCES

The club is in a sound financial state – with all arms reporting surpluses this year. This is critical and could not be achieved without the great support of our sponsors and our volunteers.

I would like to acknowledge a few sponsors in particular:

- The **Bayview Hotel** came on board this year as the inaugural ‘whole of club’ sponsor. Rod and his team have been nothing short of amazing in their support, and we really enjoy patronising such a great location;

COUNCIL ENGAGEMENT

The have also created a catalyst for significant increases in charges for playing fields – and this is something that we as a club need to address.

The new council elected in 2017 is fresh, and open to engaging with the club, so we have lots of work to do to ensure our membership’s needs are properly represented. This must be a major goal for 2018.

GOVERNANCE

The Club as a whole has adopted fiscal responsibility well, and each of the subcommittees operate in their members best interests. The harmony that we have achieved between the arms of the club is also impressive.....we are one family, and have to all work hard to maintain respect and a good set of working relationships (which is not always easy in any family).

We were able to embark a couple of great initiatives this year:

- A tremendous Season Launch – and made even more special with the 1998 Juniors Reunion;
- First Black & White Ball – which was an outstanding success;
- Significant sponsorship support to the NSW Wheelchair Rugby organization;
- Continued recognition of our role in the community with support for Beyond Blue;
- Numerous opportunities to celebrate 125 years of Black and White Rugby (and associated memorabilia – such as ‘The Angry’ port that was commissioned;
- A special 4 minute video that encapsulates why HHRUFC is so special!

Hunters Hill “Mostyn & Kellaway Shields” - Eligibility

The “Andrew Mostyn” Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season of the junior AND senior clubs combined.

The “Ian Kellaway” Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season in the junior club.

Teams eligible to participate in the Shields are teams registered with the Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club or Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Union Football Club involved in any full season, outdoor winter rugby competition administered by NSW Subbies or SJRU. (ie for juniors only includes from U10 and above)

Teams are eligible to only win one shield each season – ie the team that wins the “Andrew Mostyn” shield becomes ineligible for the “Ian Kellaway” and it shall be awarded to the next qualified team.

Hunters Hill “Club Shields” - Criteria

1. The Shield is awarded to the team which finishes the highest in its division during the regular season ie. before commencement of play-off rounds.

2. In the event that two or more teams finish in the same highest position eg. first, the winner is the team that earns the maximum percentage of competition (win/draw) points which are available to them during the regular season. Note: this excludes any bonus point system.

The maximum points available may vary depending on the number of teams in the competition draw therefore a review of the competition size is required to ensure that maximum points available from actual matches played ie. excluding byes, are the only ones included. (eg a team playing in a 6 team competition may play more games than a team in an 8 team competition providing the team with a greater opportunity to gain more total points). The calculation will be the number of wins (of games actually played) divided by the number of games played. Draws shall count as ½ of a win. This should be calculated as a percentage of the total points available calculated to 2 decimal places.

3. In the case where two or more teams obtain the same percentage of maximum points available the winner will be determined by:

- The team with the highest points ratio (points for divided by points against); and if still equal
- The team with the highest points differential from games played (points for minus points against) and if still equal
- If still equal then - Declare the relevant team's joint winners of Shield.

JUNIORS CHAIRMAN REPORT 2017

The 2017 Season didn't get off to a good start, March rain meant we and other clubs were unable to do grading and rain prevented the Northern Suburbs Gala Day the weekend before the start of the SJRU Round. After the season kicked off on the 31/3-2/4, it was smooth sailing with virtually no interruptions from rain. As usual our season is broken up by bands of school holidays, this season we had a 2 week break in April and a 3-week break in June, meaning our season was over 22 weeks long.

Sydney Junior Rugby Union took all of the Sydney Junior Clubs on a journey to a new operating system (the 3rd in 3 years??). It was clear from the start that the system was not going to suit the competitions requirements but we tried anyway. The big issue was that all the past data was lost and there was on pre-warning that the system we were using was going to disappear so clubs had no record of player contacts or player history when the new system was implemented. One of the requirements of our competition is player photos, this is a very difficult task taken on for the 2nd year in a row by our registrar Hailey Latham, what makes it particularly difficult is she would go to training and take photos of the kids (not knowing who they were) and input them into the system trying to ensure that the correct photo was being put with the correct details.... In 2018 SJRU is looking at a new system again the 4th in 4 years, hopefully they will bring the information across for the current system otherwise they will lose many of the registrars across Sydney that have put so many hours in to inapt systems that they have thrust upon the competition.

2017 saw the numbers at Hunters Hill Juniors up to 370 players registered, the biggest growth is in Try Rugby a successful program run by Greg Wyatt-Spratt, which this year has numbers approaching 40 boys and girls coming to learn. The club's measures to bolster minis numbers seems to be paying off as their numbers are growing.

The HHJRU Committee has promoted Girls Playing Rugby on the back of the success of the Australian Women's Rugby Team at the Rio Olympics, with some help of some keen young girls. Through hard work we have seen our number of girls registered as full players, or in try rugby increase from 3 in 2016 to 23 in 2017. We have 2 girls playing under 11, 13 associated with the under 7 and coming together to play under the Banner of Hunters Hill Pinks and 8 in try rugby. One initiative of the club this year has been to produce an alternate design in training tops for ladies touch and any girls in the club and a set of jerseys for the Hunters Hill Pinks and all girls that played in the juniors, wore the modified game jersey, with pink collar and pink number, which was a hit, The jersey was later also used by the senior ladies team the Boronia's. "Black & White Hoops with a touch of Pink"

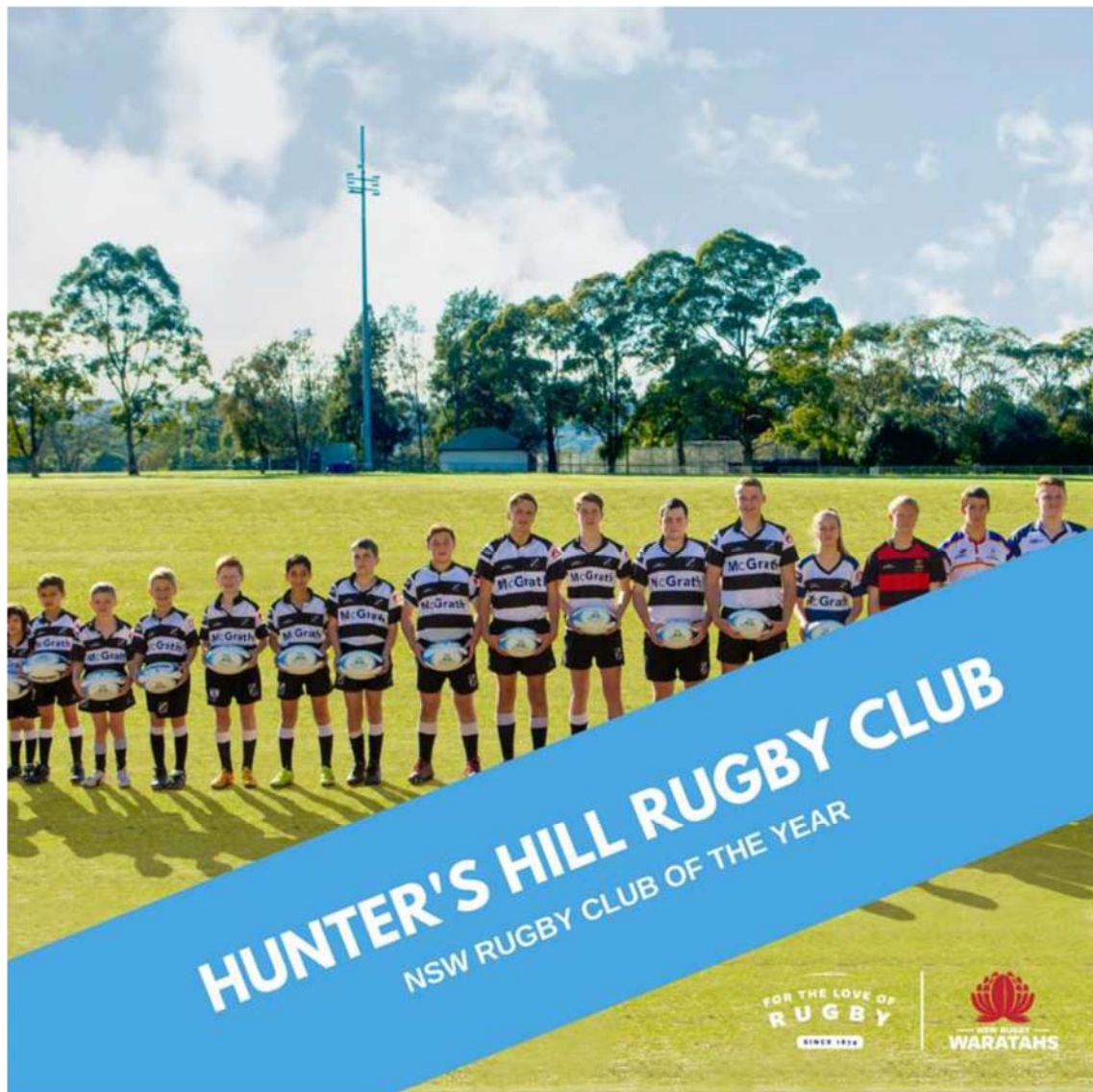

2017 Mini's Wrap Up

2017 was another successful year for the mini's with over 100 registered players representing our club across the Norths and Gordon district competition. Our numbers received a real boost from a successful beginning-of-year Facebook campaign and that translated into better engagement with parents and more kids playing. Importantly, our numbers are looking strong in the younger ages and we even managed to field an all-girls team. Quite an achievement given several of the larger clubs in our playing district could not do this.

The U9's played their last year in the mini's in two teams. With 26 players, the U9 Blacks and the U9 Whites showed up every week, rain hail or shine and put in some big hits and glorious efforts. Spirited play from all players saw them knocking off some big competition across the district with wins under their belts against taller side such as Wahroonga, Lane Cove, Mosman, Lindfield and Roseville. The Dufficy Cup challenge to these boys was accepted and gobbled up with most, if not all players showing up on both Friday nights. Whilst there was no silverware, there were a few scratches and bruises left to tell the tale. A big thanks to the following coaches and managers for taking the boys through the season: Justin Sharples, Paul Van Der Westhuizen, Rob Collins and Daniel Rose.

The U8's is first of our "new-age", up and coming groups that will see our club continue to prosper in future. Fielding 35 players, and growing even to the last week, the 8's played as the Blacks, the Whites, the Reds and the Blues. Massive efforts put in week in and out by each team, with the Blacks nearly going through the entire season undefeated, only to be pipped by a spirited Chatswood team in the dying rounds of the comp. The 8's also participated in several gala days and away comps and had a ball while doing so. The 2017 Bowral cup belongs to a HH barbarians U8's side with pledges to defend all the way through to U10's. Thanks to the army of coaches and managers for mentoring and guiding these players through the 2017 year: Chris "Axe" Atkins, James Cornell, Sam Spurr, Matt Rawnsley, Greg Cullens, Emma McCormick and Ken Pattinson.

The U7's proved to be an absolutely revolutionary age group and I won't be surprised to see a few feature in the 2035 rugby world cup. Some interesting combinations coming about so this is a group to watch. The 6's also took part in several gala days and tasted success including the heavily contested Wahroonga cup. Oh so sweet. Thanks to our keen and very patient team of coaches and managers who have set these kids off on what we hope is a life-long love affair with rugby: Sam Kanaan, Michael Stubbs, Daniel Salter, Rob Adam, Jason Petras, Adam Krass and Chris Pfafflin.

But then towards the middle and end of the season, they became well known across the club and in others, playing several games against other girls teams and the odd boys and mixed teams. 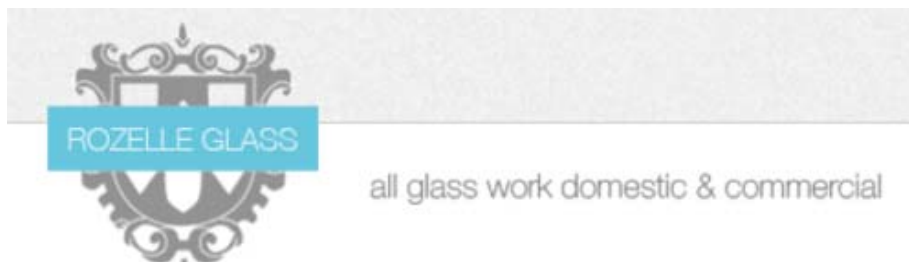

The 1st XV had an excellent year - but fell short of the ultimate prize by the smallest of margins. There was great enthusiasm in the Senior squad at the start of the year coming off the previous year's winning streak and Grand Final victory.

Despite some significant turnover of personnel, the team managed to keep that winning streak alive and complete the longest undefeated streak in the Clubs 125-year history!
A huge achievement and a fantastic success story for all those that were involved in the club this year. It should not be underestimated what a feat that was to achieve, with a third of the 2016 1st Grade side not returning in 2017.

From the start of pre-season it was clear that we had the talent at the club to go again, but the challenge from the coaching perspective was to adjust to the player departures, get to know a whole new playing group, quickly assess the playing groups strengths and implement the most appropriate game plan.

The season started slowly against UNSW who played solid rugby in our opening encounter. The feedback in the leadup to that match had been that UNSW weren't expected to be one of the stronger sides. That certainly had me raising an eyebrow in regard to what the season was about to hold.

We beat Hills comfortably in Round 2, and then had a hell of a match in the Blue Mountains in what was the Grand Final rematch from the previous year. Both teams played uncompromising rugby, and in the end we were able to grind out a hard-fought win. It was a character building experience up at Lapstone, and was an important match for the groups self-belief. The next game against Forest wasn't pretty, with complacency certainly a factor after the previous weeks win, but we secured the points late in the day.

We bounced back strongly against Beecroft with our only Shut-Out of the season 38-0. Hawkesbury Ag was an exceptionally physical encounter, and we managed to hold on for the win, despite being down to 14 players for almost half the match. Another strong character builder with our backs to the wall in the second half.

We worked our way through Lindfield which was one of the more interesting matches of the year where we had them comfortably covered in general play, but had a real battle on our hands at scrum time.

One of our best performances of the season was in the return fixture against UNSW. While the score line of 39-17 might suggest a one-sided affair, Uni didn't play badly. It was the manner in which we controlled the game, and played our most structured football that gave me confidence that we were on the right track. We were 8 from 8 when I headed overseas for two weeks.

While I was away the side continued its undefeated streak, accounting for Hills comfortably on their home deck. And then held on for another nail biter in the return fixture against Blue Mountains. My overseas Global Roaming charges were through the roof from that day!

In my first game back, we comfortably beat Forest, and etched our name in the history books consolidating the clubs longest ever winning streak. The celebrations at the Bayview were... proportionate...

The following week we took on Beecroft at Beecroft in what was a pretty ugly game. It was a very physical encounter and we didn't perform as well as we would have liked to under the pressure, but in the end we ran in a couple of late try's for the bonus point win, which secured the Minor Premiership 3 weeks out from the end of the season!



An age-old issue of sport is the ability to maintain focus on improving week-in week-out when you are on top of the table and winning each week - let alone on the clubs longest ever winning streak. In truth; we were winning games regardless of how well we were playing, and in that situation, it is easy to forget the dedication to the small details that enabled the initial success in the first place.

We arrived at Hawkesbury undefeated, top of the table, having already secured the Minor Premiership for 2017. Hawkesbury came to the ground the second placed team looking to make a statement just weeks out from the finals. Unfortunately, we weren't able to play with the intensity required for long enough, to get the result on that day. All good things must come to an end...

The result in itself wasn't a major concern, personally I thought it was the loss we had to have to refocus our efforts for the Finals, and the boys did respond during the following week. We gave Lindfield an absolute hiding in the first half of our next match, 35 nil at half time was as emphatic a performance as you will ever see.

Into the finals; and it was a rematch against Hawkesbury in the First Semi. In what was without doubt the worst conditions that I have ever been involved in. On possibly one of the worst pitches. The boys produced an outstanding half of football into a 70kmph gale straight down the field. I have never seen anything like the conditions. With the pitch more a kin to a sandpit, I was addressing 15 sand caked warriors at half time. They had done themselves proud in that first half. The message was simply that if we could produce another 40 minutes like the last, the Grand Final berth would be ours. Unfortunately, we couldn't sustain it for the 80 minutes, and we were required to take the long route to the Grand Final.

The players shared some direct thoughts in the sheds after that loss. After such a strong and committed defensive effort in the first half, the second half had been disappointing. We had been talking all year about putting 80 minutes together. We hadn't done it yet, and we had 7 days to get it right.

The Preliminary Final was against UNSW, who had been the form team in the second half of the competition. In their previous 10 matches they had only lost one game, which had been against us way back in Round 8. They were on a roll, which included beating Hawkesbury in Rnd 11. They were certainly going to be a formidable opponent, and up to the task in a Preliminary Final.

We spent a lot of time that week on our defence. Particularly our goal line and ruck defence. UNSW had obviously watched our Semi, and had seen the same chink in the armour. But when the time came in the Preliminary Final, the boys lined up and knocked them down time and time again on the fringes of the ruck - and any opportunity we had with the ball in hand was well executed. We ran out strong winners; 32-16, booking our 3rd match against Hawkesbury in 5 weeks.

Some long hours in front of the videos of the two previous matches were able to break down the Hawkesbury game plan which naturally they wouldn't be changing after their last two successful matches, and we put our plans in place to extract the final victory.

On a beautiful Grand Final day, at Concord Oval, our defence had again been outstanding in the first half, and we came into half time with a small lead. A brilliantly executed backline move putting Pate over for a try, had brought the Southern Hill at Concord to their feet - a great highlight. In the second half, more Hillies pressure led to more points, and Hawkesbury sustained a Yellow card for their continued infringing, and we extended that lead further.

We had a number of other chances through the afternoon that we just couldn't quite convert to points, and unfortunately in a Grand Final it is the team that makes the most of their chances that will prevail, and the one opportunity that Hawkesbury had, they managed to get over the line - and then sneak in front with a difficult conversion from the sideline.



We spent the rest of the game in their half pressing and probing, but on each occasion that last pass didn't quite stick, and in the end as the siren went we were awarded a penalty 40m from the sticks. 3 points was all we needed to snatch the final victory. It was a tough opportunity, with the alternative being to take the kick to touch and chance our arm at a perfect lineout and mistake free football to extract the final points. We opted for the shot at goal, but unfortunately, it wasn't to be our day.

The disappointment of losing a Grand Final is tough to describe, even more so when the result is still undecided when the final siren blows - and remains hanging on the result of a final kick. What I do know is that the burn of a lost Grand Final is the greatest motivator you will ever have in football, and I know this group will be back with a renewed focus for 2018, and without doubt they will be hard to stop. There were many great performers on that final day as well as throughout the year, but special mention from Grand Final day must go to Kali and Pate who had great games, but also to Luke and Pat who had the toughest assignments on the day containing Hawkesbury's extremely dangerous backline that had caused us so many problems in the previous encounters, they were both outstanding in defence on the final day. It was just unfortunate that we couldn't quite convert one more attacking opportunity into points.

A disappointing final minute to the season, but still a great result by the numbers; Minor Premiers, Club Champions, and a kick away from the Grand Final, every player that donned the jersey through the year can be proud of their efforts.

There are a number of volunteers at every rugby club that need to be recognised for the time that they put in to make the Club what it is, and top of that list for 1st Grade is the Team Manager Liam Cooper. The managers role is largely a thankless task, and a lot of his work goes unnoticed behind the scenes. So a big thank you from me and the team to Liam for his passion and commitment that were on display week in week out in 2017.

Further appreciation to Zak and Quinny for their work through the year. As well as Shieldsy for his work behind the scenes.

Special mention also to Jordan Butler - His work as Club Captain far exceeds anything I have seen anywhere else in my 25 years in rugby.

Thank you also to Pat Simpson for his assistance, leadership, and captaincy through the year, and congratulations to Cooper Henwood for sweeping the awards in 2017.

Congratulations to the whole Club for winning the Club Championship in such convincing fashion. I look forward to the new challenges of Division 1 in 2018. Grand Final day is only a month behind us, but already the enthusiasm from the playing group is itching to get into it for 2018, and I comfortably predict even stronger results for the Club next year.

4. Back in January it was decided our primary focus was to create an environment that players would be comfortable with throughout 2017. Whilst some may disagree we believe that this was achieved. The best example of this was throughout the season we were able to put a team on the field each week which was competitive and never through in the towel.
5. Throughout the season it became evident that there is a significant difference between a team of 18 and 19 year olds playing a team dominated by 20 and 21 year olds. I think it is fair to say that the two grand final teams in Colts Lindfield and Uni NSW were the most mature teams in the competition. Lindfield won 18 to 17.

HHRUFC - THE ARCHIVE COMMITTEE (TAC)

An archivist is an information person who assesses, collects, organises, preserves, maintains control over, and provides access to records and archives determined to have long-term value. The records maintained by an archivist can consist of a variety of forms, including letters, statistics, various other writings, official documents, sound and/or picture recordings, etc.

Archivists keep records that have enduring value as reliable memories of the past, and they help people find and understand the information they need in those records.

Determining what records have enduring value can be challenging. Archivists must also select records valuable enough to justify the costs of storage and preservation, plus the labor-intensive expenses of arrangement, description, and reference service.

The archivist handles historically significant and permanent records or objects within a collection. Archivists work to preserve, edit, and appraise the permanent records of a collection. Archivists choose records or objects in order to understand the process and overall historical context, in which the objects or records were created, correlation to other records or objects, and the intention of their use.

To do this for Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club, TAC needs the assistance and cooperation of committee members of each arm of the Club. As has been stated before, it is easier to record history now as it happens. When TAC was formed 9 years ago we 'inherited' hundreds of photos, volumes of correspondence and journals. From this we have catalogued all photos, filed correspondence into years in an orderly method, used journals and Annual Reports to create a statistics data base which any sporting club would be proud of and commenced writing up 'Our History So Far' 1892 – present. Along the way TAC has recorded video interviews of over 30 past players and supporters and through publishing many articles in newspapers have collected memorabilia from various relatives of past players. We have also requested that TAC be included on the Hunters Hill Rugby web site so that we can display what we have achieved over the past 9 years.

The problem we have each year, despite constant requests, is obtaining information to update our records. During the year we would like to receive minutes of meetings, and at the end of the season, minutes of AGMs, team photos (with names), Management and Senior team's coaches reports and notification of winners of cups/trophies. Our requests, in the main, are ignored. WE NEED YOUR HELP to continue the work that TAC was formed to do.

Speaker Zimmerman, Trent, MP **Question No.** Mr ZIMMERMAN (North Sydney) (13:59):

Local sporting clubs play such an important role in our communities in bringing people together, encouraging fitness and allowing their players to share their passion for sport. Today I want to acknowledge one of those clubs, the Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club, which is one of the oldest clubs in the Sydney suburban rugby competition and indeed Australia.

The club has its spiritual home at Boronia Park in my electorate and has well over 600 players across its divisions. This year the club is marking its 125th birthday, a considerable milestone and achievement. Known as 'Hillies', the club involves male and female players aged from four to 60.

Due to a fire in 1973, records of the early history of the club are patchy.

However, *The Sydney Morning Herald* records that it played its first trial match on the Queen's Birthday long weekend in 1892, followed by its first competition game a few days later. Other than during the interruptions of the two world wars, the club has been an important part of our community through its 125-year history.

The club's motto, 'Facta non verba'—'Deeds not words'—has been reflected in its incredible success in premierships over those years. The club is proud of its activities on and off the field with a very vibrant and active membership.

I want to acknowledge the leadership of the club—its president, Luke McCormack; the president of its juniors, Adam Latham; and its seniors president, Gary Lane. On 15 July this year the club will mark its 125th birthday.




I wish them a wonderful night of celebration and every success for many decades to come.


