CLUB PRESIDENTS REPORT – SEASON 2019

A good season on the field but more so an excellent season all round as a club. HHRUFC continue to overachieve our main goal and that is to continue the fine tradition of our club – *to promote and support community, grass roots rugby.*

The senior club, an inexplicable refereeing decision away from turning a great season into an amazing one. The last two seasons has seen the greatest change to our membership and the club as a whole, since the junior's clubs reformation of the late 90s. The growing relevance and participation of women's rugby at Hunters Hill, across both senior and junior clubs, adds much vibrancy to the club and we are a better club for it. Special mention to just some of those who have got on board and seen the future for women's rugby for us - *Lauren Salmon, Axe Atkins and Shieldsy*, along with *KOB - Sammy D* for his tireless efforts for some time with junior ladies. As I alluded to, our 1st grade senior team, taking the hardest of roads to the grand final but were very harshly dealt with at the final whistle by the referee. Our senior second grade capped off their outstanding year as premiers and with a premiership, to finish as our outstanding team across all comps. Third grade also did exceptionally well to make the grand final but met a very strong Lindfield mob and our Fourth's produced a very composed game to deliver a grand final win. Well done to our seniors playing group in 2019.

The board must acknowledge the efforts of senior's chair Luke McCormack. Luke's professional and rugby background afforded him the opportunity to understand issues the senior club needed to address to take the club forward. The benefits of having his leadership this year are self-evident and his young committee have risen to the challenges he has put to them. The efforts of the *two Tim's, Al B and the great all-rounder Blackie*, was a major contributor to a vibrant senior's season, well supported by sound fiscal oversight provided by club stalwart - *Macca*.

With all due respect too many who have gone before, the coaching across seniors this year was of a very high standard and the coaches level of commitment set a standard the players were asked to match but also benefitted greatly from. Having very experienced senior coaches in *Philpy, Simon and Benny*, along with their support crews and the work done in co-operation with lower grades coaches, a large factor in the results that were achieved.

Our junior club, more than ever, fulfils its key performance indicator. We continue to take every opportunity to promote rugby as a winter sport option, heavily to the local community. Juniors focus on and investment in growth areas continues to deliver. Hunters Hill continue to put on the most vibrant junior rugby event going in Sydney and anywhere. *Spratty's little angels*, (under fives Try Rugby) grab their patch of turf on number one oval before the hoards of mini (under 6 – under 9s) aspirants converge in a mass of bodies and movement for training. Then in amongst them, you will find a group of pretty little things in pink training jerseys, having the time of their

lives. The barby's pumping as the wine and beer is chilling, club champion **Bonnie Gregory** running the show all to the club chair, Lathos eclectic beat pumping out loud. All in preparation as our under 10s, 11s and 12s get ready for some serious Friday night SJRU rugby Competition under lights.

Juniors SJRU teams (under 10s to U16s) came away with a highly respectable - 3 Sydney Junior Rugby Union premierships this year and we fielded joint venture teams with other local clubs in the under 15 and U16 age groups. A major tick in the rugby box of a club like ours to be keeping boys playing our game at the older age levels.

Adam Latham, much as junior's tradition allows for will conclude his third years as juniors president this year. He has more than matched and likely exceeded a pretty high standard set by many of his predecessors. He was fantastically supported by and with his family. **Hailey Latham** efforts on the behalf of the club for many years not just worthy of mention but at times the sound voice of (female) logic amongst the boof-heads. A strong junior committee effort this year, with special mention to **Bec Ho** whose unbounded energy delivers so much for the club. **Gareth James**, again another year of fine loyal service managing junior's finances and massive thankyou on behalf of the club to **Chad Quinn**. Hunters Hill “Mostyn & Kellaway Shields” - Eligibility

The “Andrew Mostyn” Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season of the junior AND senior clubs combined.

The “Ian Kellaway” Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season in the junior club.

Teams eligible to participate in the Shields are teams registered with the Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club or Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Union Football Club involved in any full season, outdoor winter rugby competition administered by NSW Subbies or SJRU. (ie for juniors only includes from U10 and above)

Teams are eligible to only win one shield each season – ie the team that wins the “Andrew Mostyn” shield becomes ineligible for the “Ian Kellaway” and it shall be awarded to the next qualified team.

Hunters Hill “Club Shields” - Criteria

1. The Shield is awarded to the team which finishes the highest in its division during the regular season ie. before commencement of play-off rounds.
2. In the event that two or more teams finish in the same highest position eg. first, the winner is the team that earns the maximum percentage of competition (win/draw) points which are available to them during the regular season. Note: this excludes any bonus point system.
The maximum points available may vary depending on the number of teams in the competition draw therefore a review of the competition size is required to ensure that maximum points available from actual matches played ie. excluding byes, are the only ones included. (eg a team playing in a 6 team competition may play more games than a team in an 8 team competition providing the team with a greater opportunity to gain more total points). The calculation will be the number of wins (of games actually played) divided by the number of games played. Draws shall count as ½ of a win. This should be calculated as a percentage of the total points available calculated to 2 decimal places.
3. In the case where two or more teams obtain the same percentage of maximum points available the winner will be determined by:
 - a) The team with the highest points ratio (points for divided by points against); and if still equal
 - b) The team with the highest points differential from games played (points for minus points against) and if still equal
 - c) If still equal then - Declare the relevant team’s joint winners of Shield.

2019 Season report

2019 has been another great year for Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Union.

Try Rugby has maintained its strong numbers with over 30 players aged 3-5 just starting with Hunters Hill Rugby, under the Stewardship of Greg Wyatt-Spratt. We will be running this program again in 2020 but are going to step it up and get the parents more involved so not only is Greg producing our players of the future, he will produce some coaches and other volunteers to assist. We will also target preschools and day care to increase numbers.

The internal girls touch rugby program on a Friday night continued to be great fun for the girls, which see's 35+ girls playing in internal touch, under the leadership of Kingston Lee-Young. This year the girls had an unabated run on Boronia 2 moving to Boronia 1 when there wasn't Friday night games.

Our number of teams in the mini's is 10 (11 if we count the Pink Flamingo's, our girls' team that played week in week out in mixed sides but come together as the flamingos for special events, gala days and tournaments) in 2018. We still have some work to do to strengthen some age groups, but it's a work in progress.

Our mini's who are part of the Gordon Mini's Competition enjoyed our home rounds, with generally all sides playing together at Boronia Park. During the season across district gala days were played, this was a good initiative and saw our sides play 3-4 games against different clubs from outside



Gordon Minis. A highlight was when our minis headed out to Norwest, the under 7's and 8's played first from 8am-10am, the under 6's and U9's arrived at 10am for their later morning games. This allowed us to come together for club sprints and also club Tug-O-War..... So much fun with about 150 boys and girls on each end of the rope. Hunters Hill made the final of the Tug-O-War but lost to Norwest in the final.

Our junior rugby had 12 sides, with 3 sides in the under 10's. The club fielded 5 joint venture sides, one in the Under 11's HH/Drummoyne, U13's HH/Ryde, the U15's formed 2 district sides along with our Northern Suburbs counterparts HH, Drummoyne and Mosman. Our under 16's formed a joint venture with Lane Cove. The clubs preference is always to try and stand alone, when this isn't possible we firstly look to form a JV with our Northern Suburbs Village Clubs, Drummoyne, Mosman and Norths Pirates, when this isn't possible we look further afield to locationally suitable clubs for training, hence the JV's this year with Lane Cove and Ryde.

The 2019 season was a little trying for us all. Unfortunately, Sydney Junior Rugby Union couldn't deliver the draw in a reasonable fashion to clubs. We were finding out about our juniors U10-U16 games generally on Wednesday or Thursday before we played. This was a source of much frustration for all. Sydney Juniors are making steps to ensure this is not an issue in 2020 and after the initial grading period we are promised season long draws. It is Hunters Hill Juniors Preference to hold our U10-U12 Home Games at Boronia Park on Friday nights, unfortunately this season the competition manager only schedule 2 of our 42 available games on Friday night.

A special mention this year needs to go Rob Dufficy and Jim Lloyd who for a number of years have been associated with the Joeys Cerise Under 13's, this is a side made up of Joeys year 7 boarders. This year they also ran a under 14's side at the year 8 boarders request, a job well done guys.

Finals

Of our 12 Junior sides 5 were eligible to be Involved in shield or plate finals. All games are sudden death and come week 2 we saw 4 remaining in Shield Finals 10 Red, 11 Honey Badgers, 13 HH/Ryde and 13 Cerise. The 10 Reds had the advantage of playing their Grand Final at Boronia as Hunters Hill hosted the Under 10 Grand Finals, they had a great victory and where the juniors club most successful team in the regular season, winners of the Ian Kellaway Shield. Unfortunately, the 11 Honey Badgers went down in a tough game to Roseville. The U13 Grand Final in the E division saw HH/Ryde JV side take on Hunters Hill Cerise, a guaranteed victory for Hunters Hill, with 1 side sure to be very happy and 1 sure to be a little sad, unless the U13 final of 2013 can be replicated with a draw.... It was not to be the Cerise boys were too strong on the day for the JV side. Well done to all the lads and lasses involved in the final's series for Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Union. Our Monday night ladies touch has grown to over 70 players, we run a internal series with 7 teams playing a round robin format through school term 3, ending in a Grand Final, where the ladies play for the converted Georgie, modelled on our Ladies Touch Coordinator and very own King of Beers Mr Sam Dermody. The winners also receive medallions, this season the Grand Final was taken out by the Green Giants.

I would like to thank all the volunteer Age coordinators, coaches and managers who give up their time for the kids. remember if you haven't picked up your jacket please see Abigail under the grandstand after this presentation concludes.

Off the field...

We have implemented a number of new programs.

As a Juniors club we have hosted a lot of events in 2019, like 2 Dufficy cups, the Under 10 Grand Finals, the 4 District Northern Suburbs Gala Day. However unfortunately weather affected us with some of our major events, the Northern Suburbs Gala Day had to be partially moved to Drummoyne due to oval closures. The GPS V CHS, GPS V SJRU, games were moved to Joeys following slight rain and the council closing the grounds. Similarly, the Regionals Weekend had to be moved as Hunters Hill Council were concerned that it may rain over the weekend. We also held the end of Season Presentation at Gladesville Sporties rather than Boronia Park.

Dufficy Cup

The Dufficy cup continues to be one of the great highlights of the Junior Rugby Season, Ben Gregory does a fantastic job in pulling it all together every year. The 7 available spots on the 2-3 nights it is run each year a highly sort after. It's a round robin format for under 9 sides at the end of their season, played on a full field using the under 10 junior rules something they will move up to next season. Juniors Training Jersey Design

Each year the Junior Club runs a training jersey design competition, this year again there were many entries, the designs were shortlisted and 10 entries went to our selection committee, one design was selected and the concept design was sent to our gear supplier Canterbury who then produce the final design (one for the boys and male coaches and one with a touch of pink for the girls, female coaches and ladies touch. Alex Noble is a local lad previously living at Tennyson Point and now at Gladesville. Alex, played 4 seasons for Hunters Hill Juniors before starting school at St Ignatius College (Riverview) and moving to another junior club with his school mates. Alex's was a sportsman, a fabulous natural athlete at any ball sport, not just Rugby Union, but League, Soccer, Cricket, Basket Ball and also Athletics and Swimming. On 24th October 2018, whilst training with the NSW U16 7's side, Alex was involved in an incident that broke his neck. It was extremely serious, and Alex was lucky to survive, but is now a quadriplegic. To support Alex, the 3 arms of the club, Juniors, Seniors and the Board, decided to buy an auction item at a fund raiser for Alex late last year. This item was re-auctioned at the Clubs Season Launch and through the all of club purchase and the re-auction raised more than \$5000 for Alex. Juniors also decided to support Alex's with wearing his war cry on our sleeves I FIGHT YOU FIGHT!

2019 Registrars Report

12th November 2019

Registration Systems:

- This year the SJRU moved us to the Rugby Australia registration system RugbyXplorer
- It was not without problems
- We will continue to use Rugby Xplorer in 2020

Player Numbers:

In 2019, HHJRU offered teams from U6 to U16s, TryRugby for our littlest players, Girls Friday Nite Touch and Ladies Touch. Although we were not able to field a team in U15 (we were part of a three way joint venture, we had JVs in U11, U13 and U16, and Joeys provided us with both a U13 and U14 side.

Ladies Touch (under the command of Sam Dermody) reached its 7th year.

In its fifth year, TryRugby (under the command of Greg Wyatt-Spratt) continues to be a huge success with 18 kids registered.

In 2018, we introduced a "Friday Nite Girls Touch Competition". This year the competition started just after the SJRU season, due to the school holidays interrupting the season start, and ran until the end of the SJRU season. In the end we had over 30 girls registered and we were able to form two age groups U6-U8 and U9-U11. A huge thank you to Kingston Lee for continuing to oversee this program. Next year we will need to make some changes to ensure the girls continue to grow in their skill and game play development.

- Total Players U6-U16: 300 (last year was 310, although this year's number included some Lane
- Cove, Drummoyne and Ryde boys in our JV)

- Ladies Touch: Approximately 60 players, 5 teams
- TryRugby: 18 players (30 last year)
- Girls Friday Nite Touch: 32

Minis player numbers only 70% of last year, which is due to a large drop in the U9 age group (from 44 players in the U8, to only 24 in the U9) and TryRugby (although I think 18 is more manageable than 30)

Junior Rugby Registrations for 2018 (compared to same age group in the previous years)

- Unfortunately, our Premiership winning U14 side from 2018 attempted to form a JV with Norths Village sides, meaning only 9 HHJRU player registered this year.
- Great to see the U16 almost field a side on their own, although it was a JV with Lane Cove
- U14 again fielded only a Cerise team
- U13 was only half a team and formed a JV with Ryde. There was also a Cerise U13 side
- Otherwise fairly consist numbers within age groups.

U12 Hong Kong Tour 2019

The 2019 U11/U12/U13 Hong Kong Tour was another amazing success, and hopefully will generate return players for all three age groups!

Registration Fees

In 2018 the NSW Government introduced an Active Kids Rebate of \$100 per child per year. This year registration fees were again increased:

Girls Friday Night Touch \$100 (\$100 in 2018)

Ladies \$75 (\$50 in 2018)

U5 TryRugby \$100 (\$100 in 2018, but offered \$50 for preschoolers)

U6-U7 \$100 (\$100 in 2018)

U8-U9 \$150 (\$130 in 2018)

U10-U12 \$250 (\$225 in 2018)

U13-U16 \$250 (\$225 in 2018)

U17-U18 \$250 (\$225 in 2018)

This year we stopped offering a sibling discount, as it was clunky to set up within the new Registration system and the Active Kids Voucher also complicated the accounting.

Hardship cases were judged by the Age Coordinator.

Summary

Our registration numbers for Minis experienced a significant drop this year. Hopefully we are back to strength next year. It is very important to clearly communicate to players, parents, coaches and managers what our HHJRU philosophy is during the promotion of the Club and during the Registration drives.

Our Junior Rugby numbers appear steady, but they are bolstered by players from the Ryde, Drummoyne and Lane Cove JVs and our Cerise sides.

The Rebel vouchers for bringing along a new player worked well, but will need better communication to work next year. A few extra players can be the difference between an extra team, or not needing to create a JV.

We need to assign HHJRU/School Ambassador parents to each of the local schools to help promote our Club. We get more registrations from schools with which we have a close relationship.

Girls Touch is a successful project. It will need some work to allow it to grow, and Kingston will need more support in the form of coaches and managers. It might be worth considering entering one of the SJRU run programs, or looking to Drummoyne, Ryde and Lane Cove for close local competition.

Ladies touch continues to amble along with between 50-60 players each year. This competition need more promotion.

TryRugby is a great program. We do need to try to promote it in preschools. If we can get kids/parents involved in the Club when they are at preschool, it will help us develop the U6 and U7 age groups.

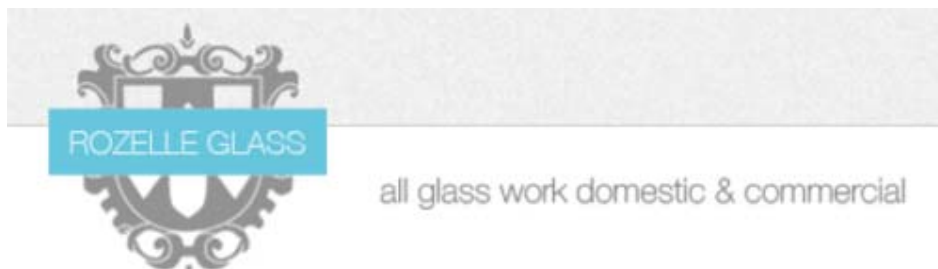

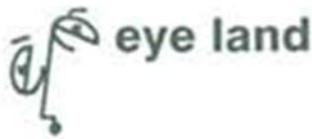

HHRUFC - THE ARCHIVE COMMITTEE (TAC)

Report to Board as at November 2019

The Club's Board approved the establishment of an Archive Committee (TAC) in late 2008 and we have now been active for 11 years.

The role of the Committee was not specifically defined, rather the Committee was asked to consider the circumstances, the records and the context, and develop a strategy.

Objectives

The Committee identified the following as its objectives:

1. Catalogue all historical material held by the Club.
2. Develop standards for resolving the authenticity of historical records.
3. Investigate and resolve particular questions which the Board may refer to it.
4. Record the history of the Club faithfully and accurately.
5. Advise the Club on storage and maintenance of its historical records
6. Assist with the preparation of historical material for publication (e.g. on the website, in special publications etc)
7. Provide advice on displaying photos and memorabilia.
8. Plan and develop suitable displays of the Club's history
9. Secure funding to facilitate the establishment and ongoing maintenance of the Club's archives and history, including provision for future displays and/or exhibitions.

Tasks and Priorities

The major tasks we progressed over the 11 years were::

1. Establishing a database to record details of the Club's memorabilia collection
2. Cataloguing and storing all memorabilia to archival standards
3. Determining the most appropriate method to ultimately and progressively store records on the internet
4. Scanning the Club's photographic collection to archival standards
5. Completion of a Games and Players database, recording
 - a. available details of every match played by the Club
 - b. every player who has represented the Club
 - c. every player who has achieved representative status
6. Collecting any available videos and establishing suitable archiving procedures for preserving film records
7. Digitisation of the Club's Annual Reports to produce a searchable document.

Broadly speaking we have achieved what was within our capacity to do. This includes;

- Imaging and catalogued every photo held that was both significant and relevant to the Club
- Imaged all hard copy items by year - press cuttings, memos, Minutes, accounts, Annual reports, etc
- Documented the Club's first 125 (1892-2017) years, based on available records
- Created a data base of players records as far back as hard copy documents allowed (typically from about 1970 onwards)
- Organised a number of displays to coincide with "Back To Boronia Days", during the season
- Rationalised and disposed of material that was not relevant or significant to the Club.

Keeping in mind the ongoing challenge of storage, we have also disposed of most of what we collected after imaging. We have done this so that we might be able to vacate Henley at the end of this financial year (or if required to by Hunters Hill Council) and save rental. We also reflected on the reality of the amount of any space that might be made available for this material in any community centre.

The current rental period continues until 30 June 2020. If the Club decided to keep the facility for ongoing storage it could be utilised by other arms of the Club. If the Club decides to not continue rental, then the remaining archive material would need to be relocated.

So, the task of capturing what we had has been completed.

When we established TAC at the end of 2008, social media was in its infancy. Twitter and Facebook had only just started, and Instagram hadn't been developed.

Our primary focus then was based around utilising a Club website to both store and make material available.

Today, the "go to" social media point for information for Club members would be different depending on age.

The current members of TAC have taken this activity as far as we can. We believe the Club now needs to:

1. Resolve how the Club will use social media to communicate to members and other interested parties
2. Commit funding and resources to make this happen
3. Find someone in the Club to "own" and use the material TAC have gathered and stored, and then use this material
4. Make sure ongoing records, photos, etc continue to be captured and stored
5. Consider how the story of our first 125 years might be economically and effectively shared with members and the broader community.

When the Club gets to the point of have broadly achieved 1-4 above, we would be more than happy to sit down and show – whoever - what we have and offer ongoing help.

In conclusion, we would like to thank the Club for the financial support given to help us with purchases of material to progress our activity, and for the provision of the space at Henley. We would also like to sincerely thank Steve Lane who has continued to encourage us and has provided additional financial support.

It would also be remiss to not formally acknowledge the contributions of two members of the Committee no longer with us – Bruce Lycett and Allan Southcombe.
