CLUB PRESIDENTS REPORT – SEASON 2020

Strange season? Challenging? So what,.....everyone just got on with it.

We managed to fit in half a season. Some teams even had the opportunity to play in the finals and WIN.

The Juniors got on with it and fielded teams in all the age groups including Try Rugby and Minis.

The parents and children got to see more of Sydney than they might have planned but most importantly they played rugby. Representative teams did not go ahead as in past years but that's understandable, the children can get even more excited about trying out next year.

The Dufficy Cup will recommence next year. Girl's touch went ahead on Friday nights as did the Boys U12 Summer Sevens.

Congratulations to Angus Bell and James Ramm, former Juniors, for their selection in the Waratahs and then the Wallabies Squad with Angus going on to play his first test against the All Blacks.

What a great testament to the strength of our Juniors and the effort put in by all concerned.

The Seniors had a stunning season fielding 5 men's sides. Success was easy to measure - undefeated Premiers in Barraclough Cup (First grade) and Stockdale Cup (Second grade) and winners of the Reliance Shield as Second Division Club Champions. How good is that! But there is more, our hugely talented women's 7's side were Runners Up in Second Division of the Sydney competition.

The excitement on the field was matched nearly as much by what happened off the field.

Firstly, significant steps were taken in developing the Community Facility. The Council's Plan of Management was approved and includes a location for the Facility between Ovals one and two at Boronia. A Memorandum of Understanding has been signed with the Council to guide the further development including tenure at Boronia. The process of appointing an Architect to design the building is well underway. Stay tuned for more developments.

Earlier in the year the Council completed the drainage on Boronia 3 so that it can be relied on as an all-weather ground for which we can schedule matches. Twelve eager and able CATS also made themselves available to plant out the northern bank of B3 with 800 native plants and grasses to properly complete the project. We are proud to have been able to work with Council to achieve this. Ask anyone who has played or trained on B3, it is a wonderful field.

We have a strong working relationship with Council, both of us working towards a better local community.

On another community note, a club tour to the South Coast to support our rugby cousins in Broulee through their bushfire nightmare was unfortunately postponed due to Covid19. It is hoped that we

will be able to undertake this trip in the near future, reinforcing our desire to be a community focused club.

Finally, thank you to our players and volunteers for making such a success out of difficult circumstances.

Here's to a less strange and challenging season in 2021.

Hunters Hill "Mostyn & Kellaway Shields" - Eligibility

The "Andrew Mostyn" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season of the junior AND senior clubs combined.

The "Ian Kellaway" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season in the junior club.

Teams eligible to participate in the Shields are teams registered with the Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club or Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Union Football Club involved in any full season, outdoor winter rugby competition administered by NSW Subbies or SJRU. (ie for juniors only includes from U10 and above)

Teams are eligible to only win one shield each season – ie the team that wins the "Andrew Mostyn" shield becomes ineligible for the "Ian Kellaway" and it shall be awarded to the next qualified team.

Chairman's Report

The Covid-19 Season. 2020 will be a season that everyone involved with the Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Club will remember forever. The season looked bright in January with the usual organisation of two *Try Rugby* days and the Under 11s and 12s putting in preseason work focusing on areas of the game identified as needing improvement the season prior. The *Try Rugby* days were again a success and two of our favourite Waratahs Ned Hannigan and Ryan McAuley were in attendance to guide our young chargers.

Things were running smoothly into February until we heard grumblings of the virus and then by March everything was shutdown and thoughts turned towards whether we would even have a 2020 rugby season at all. To their credit the HHJRU Committee kept working behind the scenes hoping that if a season was to get a green light we would be ready to go.

After months of inactivity and the "lockdown" the State Government announced that community sport could resume training in June and following that a season of competition could commence in late July. Many thanks must be given to our Club Covid Officer, Adam Latham, for going above and beyond to ensure we followed the government guidelines and we as a Club were able to get the kids on the paddock to play against other clubs in the truncated 2020 SJRU and Gordon Minis competitions. It was through Adam's hard and time consuming work that when the unexpected, but unfortunately inevitable, happened and a member of our Club tested positive to Covid-19 we were able to contain the situation and no further transmissions occurred within the Club.

Under trying circumstances a season began like no other season before it. No finals, no Representative rugby and motions put in place to provide some "friendly" rugby so the kids of greater Sydney could get some matches played. Nine rounds in total and lots of lessons for players, coaches and administrators alike.



Registrations were lower with HHJRU than previous seasons, the main reason probably that a season may not go ahead at all and families unsure whether to commit when there was so much uncertainty that the children might not play at all and whether it was actually safe to play. In the Sydney Juniors competition HHJRU had one Under 10s squad, three Under 11s, one Under 12s and an Under 14s Joint Venture squad with Ryde Junior Rugby Club. In the Gordon Minis competition HHJRU fielded two teams in every age group; Under 6s, Under 7s, Under 8s and Under 9s. The Women's Touch didn't go ahead this season, but Girls Touch ran every Friday evening alongside Mini's Training coached admirably by Damien Clayton. Super coach Greg Wyatt-Spratt, king of the kids, instructed Try Rugby for the littlies again and much fun was had by all, some of the four and five year olds even moved up into Minis to help out the Under 6 teams.

Our Training Shirt design was won this year by the Stephenson's with their amazing tribute to those that fought the horrible bushfires of the 2019/2020 summer. More colour than designs of seasons past, every training session comments were heard of how good the flames were. HHJRU also, **for the first time**, has an Under 12s & 13s rugby squad in action in SJRU's boys summer 7's competition ongoing through October and November. Made up of boys from our 2020 Under 11s they have been performing admirably against often older, bigger boys.

With the Covid restrictions we were unable to host some mainstays of the rugby season. Our Pre-season Northern Suburbs Gala Day was cancelled and with the NSW Juniors Representative season being also cancelled our annual Mother's Day Classic Rep Trials and Champagne was not held. Probably the biggest disappointment of the season though was not being able to hold The Dufficy Cup. Ben Gregory puts so much effort into this event and it is such a great spectacle for all parents involved from the many clubs that participate, let alone the amazing learning experience it is for the kids playing.

With the Juniors season not having any finals and in a sense not being "competitive" the Andrew Mostyn and Ian Kellaway Shields were not awarded. Outstanding Service Awards were awarded to Chris "Axe" Atkins, Jordan Pond, Mark Thornton, Rob Collins, John Evans and Paul Van der Westhuizen. Very importantly, The Allan Southcombe Award went to Jordan Pond for his continued coaching support of this year's Under 14s after guiding this team season after season as well as running around with the Seniors Club. The Bruce "Angry" Lycett Award went to fantastic Clubman Chris "Axe" Atkins who coached the Women's 7s team as well as the Under 11 Blacks and is always found helping in any capacity at the Club. Congratulations gentlemen.

Off The Field

The end of 2019 saw a fresh faced Executive Committee elected. Massive praise to outgoing club stalwarts Hailey (Registrar) and Adam Latham (Chairman) stepping down from "official" roles, but still holding the hands of the new people filling big positions. Vice Chair Chad Quinn also stepped away from the Executive Committee after many years of faithful service. Paul Van der Westhuizen was voted into the Chair position, Damien Clayton into the Vice Chair and Minis Coordinator role and Nadia Clayton into the Registrar Role. Gareth James returned as Treasurer as did Bec Ho as Secretary.

It was a very hard season to manage with so much uncertainty. Executive Committee Meetings had to be held through video conference calls which just didn't make up for the camaraderie our Club has. BYO's at home on zoom wasn't too flash either. The Committee, however, powered on. The Club was ready to go once we were allowed to start training So thank you to all those involved with running the Club.

It was a very difficult year to run the Canteen due to restrictions surrounding the Covid Pandemic and during 2020 the Senior Club opened the canteen to serve us on Saturday Minis home games. A huge thank you to Bonnie Gregory who will be passing the torch to new canteen administrators next season. Bonnie is a huge part of HHJRU and has invested so much time into our canteen to give our Club a very solid financial foothold and also a social gathering point for our Friday nights. Bonnie will be sorely missed and leave a big hole in the fabric that is Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Club.

A massive positive out of the year 2020 season was the Community Facility finally getting Hunters Hill Council's approval to move forward. Through hard work of the Hunters Hill Rugby Board



progress is being fast made towards the building of the community facility. Big thanks also to Council for waiving ground hire costs during this unprecedented season.

Thank you to our fantastic sponsors who stuck with us through this season even though the Club only played half the normal amount of games and spent only half the normal amount of time training and playing. John and McGrath Real Estate, Garry and Kerry at Jaycar, Cameron at On Deck, Yvonne and John from Gladesville Orthodontics, Nicolle and Crust Pizza Gladesville and our newest sponsors Amanda and Cav & Co. Café. We hope to continue the great partnerships next season.

And finally, a huge high note to end the season on. Angus Bell & James Ramm, two past HHJRU members making their debuts for the New South Wales Waratahs and following the season both were selected to the Wallabies squad for the 2020 Bledisloe Cup with Angus making his Wallabies debut in the Second Test. Congratulations to both these fine young men.

U12 Hong Kong Tour 2020

Due to Covid- 19 an international travel ban was put in place by the Australian Government meaning the annual Hong Kong trip was cancelled.

Ladies Touch Competition

Covid-19 prevented a Ladies touch competition from taking place this year. At the time the competition runs NSW was in a lockdown with only essential personnel permitted to travel for work purposes or individual exercise and shopping. Whilst restrictions were lifted for group sport in Unfortunately there was not enough time in the Rugby season to advertise or run the Ladies competition this year on restrictions were lifted on team sport.

Registration Fees

Registration fees were raised for some age groups this year:

Hardship cases were judged by the Age Coordinator and were expected to contribute half of the registration fee.

Ladies \$50

I recommend holding our registration fees steady for 2021, as we have increased them the past two years running.

I would also like to see the U6/U7 registration fee remain at the promotion level of \$100 just enough to cover the NSW kids voucher – this is the age when we really get kids into rugby and nurture them through the age groups.

Registration Days

Registration day has changed into a “come and try day” with the introduction of the RugbyExplorer portal. Parents and players use the self-service portal to register so the need for club members to receive payments etc. is redundant. The need for club members who have a sound understanding of the club and the different age groups/ routines/ season dates means people who come down to the field leave with all the right information and are more likely to engage with the club in the following season. A key takeaway is where parents had questions but there was no one to answer them at the question booth on the try out day.

Late Payments

No longer an issue as the payments are taken exclusively through Rugby Explorer portal. Refunds are managed outside of the portal and there were 7 refunds this year mainly due to Covid related cancellations.

Summary

This year began with a dim outlook with a forced locked down and slow return to contact play. Teams had a break of many months and we were lucky to retain the number this year that we did. The rebel vouchers brought a few new players into the Hunters Hill juniors’ family and we will need to work hard next season to cement the relationships we have nurtured throughout this year.

HUNTERS HILL JUNIOR RUGBY CLUB **TREASURER REPORT – 2020 SEASON**

Please note that the P & L extract and Balance Sheet are **UNAUDITED at as today and are therefore subject to any change.**

The Juniors' financial information will be consolidated with the other bodies of the Club (Seniors, Cats) to form the consolidated "statutory" accounts for HHRUFC Inc.

Profit & Loss Commentary

It became evident in early 2020 (for obvious reasons) that there was no longer any relevance in the budget that we set. With the onset of the coronavirus, the uncertainty of a season start date, the economic impact on families and sponsors, and the obvious difficulties of running a canteen with social distancing measures, we could be forgiven for thinking we would face significant financial struggles this season.

However, in the face of these difficulties I am very happy to advise that in the 2020 season HHJRFC recorded an operating surplus of \$ 24,371 (2019: \$18,560) an \$6K increase on the prior year surplus and also in excess of the budgeted surplus.

Revenue

The revenue for 2020 was significantly reduced over the 2019 season as a result of reduced registration fees, no canteen income and a 50% reduction in sponsorship income. Your Committee made the decision, due to the shortened season, to only ask the sponsors for 50% of the contracted sponsorship fee for the 2020 season. Assuming the 2021 season moves ahead with a fuller season, we will revert to the full contracted sponsorship income. Next season (2021) will be the final season of our rolling 3-year sponsorship contracts.

Our canteen income was \$40K less than 2019, which highlights just how important the canteen has been in the ongoing success and financial strength of the club. If circumstances allow, we will certainly be running a canteen next year under different stewardship than the incredible Bonnie Gregory, to whom we will be forever grateful.

Player registrations for the reduced season were a very pleasing \$35K, only about 20% down on the \$43K in 2019 – a remarkable achievement and testament to the sales and marketing abilities of many of our Committee and club supporters.

Of course, we were not able to hold any fundraising events in 2020, another area where our revenue was impacted. Overall, we reported revenue of \$62K compared to \$134K in 2019, a reduction of \$(72)K in total.

Expenses

With significantly reduced income, it was important that we kept tight control of our expenses, and the reported surplus of \$24K is evidence that were able to manage the expenses commensurate with the revenue reduction.

Operating expenses were \$38K in 2020 compared to \$99K in 2019, a reduction of \$61K.

The key areas where we had cost savings over 2109 were.

- Ground Hire – 2019 expense of \$10K but no cost in 2020 as HHC generously agreed to waive ground hire fees for the season.
- Gear purchases – in 2019 we had new sponsors on board and as a result we purchased brand new sets of playing jerseys for all sides at significant cost. We saved \$20K over the 2019 expense.
- Merchandise – given the uncertainty surrounding the season start dates, we did not purchase any merchandise for resale in 2020, saving \$5K over 2019 (but also reduced revenue).
- We held no functions or events in 2020 and saved \$6K over 2019.
- We also reduced the end of season gifts and trophies, photography, and general presentation costs, saving a further \$6K.

Cash on Hand – Juniors Accounts

The Juniors have a health cash balance which has accumulated over recent years in the knowledge that a significant portion of the funds are set aside to assist in funding the development of a proposed community facility.

As at 31 October 2020 the club held funds of \$340,425 (2019: \$323,945). As most of you present tonight will be aware, the Juniors have committed to make a significant contribution from these available funds to the development of the new Community Facility, whilst retaining sufficient funds to ensure the ongoing success and development of one of NSW leading junior rugby union clubs.

Seniors Chairman's Report 2020

I am proud to lead the Senior Club at Hunters Hill Rugby, and I am proud to be able to tell you that all of the horrible challenges of 2020 were forgotten on Saturday for a few sweet hours – when community sport transported our players and supporters to a place of far, far away. Two undefeated premierships for our top two senior squads were a fitting reward for the dedication and hard work of our Coaches, Players and Supporters in the last few crazy months! Hunters Hill Rugby Club competes in Division 2 of the Sydney Suburban Rugby Competition (fondly known as 'Subbies'). We are the fourth oldest club in Australia with 128 years of rich history and were looking forward to a big season in 2020.

When the COVID lockdown started – all of our pre-season work and preparation was put on hold, and we did not know whether we would have a competition. As the months ticked by and the hopes of our players started to fade, we started to think that there would be no rugby this year....which was a heartbreaking prospect for an ancient club like ours....

Thankfully as the COVID restrictions started to lift – and through some amazing work of the team at NSW Rugby – we were given a clear set of protocols and the promise of a competition. Training with hand sanitiser, social distancing, and COVID registers was new and challenging for all of us. It then became more complicated when NSW Rugby were miraculously able to launch a viable competition as we had to then contend with no revenue from our closed canteens, telling our players to 'play & go' and also letting our fiercely loyal supporters know that they were not welcome to games....

All of these sacrifices were things we were willing to do to keep our players safe – and the community protected. I would also like to pay tribute to the creative thinking of Hunters Hill Council – who worked with us to enable access to Boronia Park while at the same time keeping our members safe.

Now that playing rugby became a viable consideration – we started to set some goals. Our first was to win the Division Club Championship.
